


To access Training Video Now go to www.trainingvideonow.com. If you have Trainer access, you were given a User Name and Password. Use both of these to sign in under the Trainer Login on the left side of the page.

Playing Videos

PLAY VIDEOS FROM YOUR WATCHLIST.

Launch any video in your Watchlist by clicking the Play button. If you have both an English and a Spanish version choose the language you want to view.

The video will open in a new tab where you can play full screen by double clicking the video area or the full screen icon on the right side of the control bar of the video player. You can also control the volume and if subtitles/captions are available you can turn them on and off.



Basic Trouble Shooting

If you are experiencing issues with playing video on this site please speak with your IT personnel.

The steps listed below should be reviewed with your Information Services personnel . We do not recommend making changes to your computers settings without speaking to your Information Services personnel.

This streaming video service will work with most recent browsers. The best browsers for video playback with Windows are: IE 11/Edge, Chrome (Google), Firefox (Mozilla) If you are not using the most recent version of these browsers the flash player plugin maybe required.

Javascript needs to be enabled. You also need to be able to access data sources across domains. Depending upon what the network or individual computer settings are, the following steps may be of use.

Internet Explorer

One: Check to see if javascript has been disabled. This [website](#) has a test to show if it is disabled and how to enable it if need be.

Two: In Internet Explorer add this site to the compatibility settings. See this page to add this site to the [compatibility list](#).

Three: Cross Origin Access Denied:

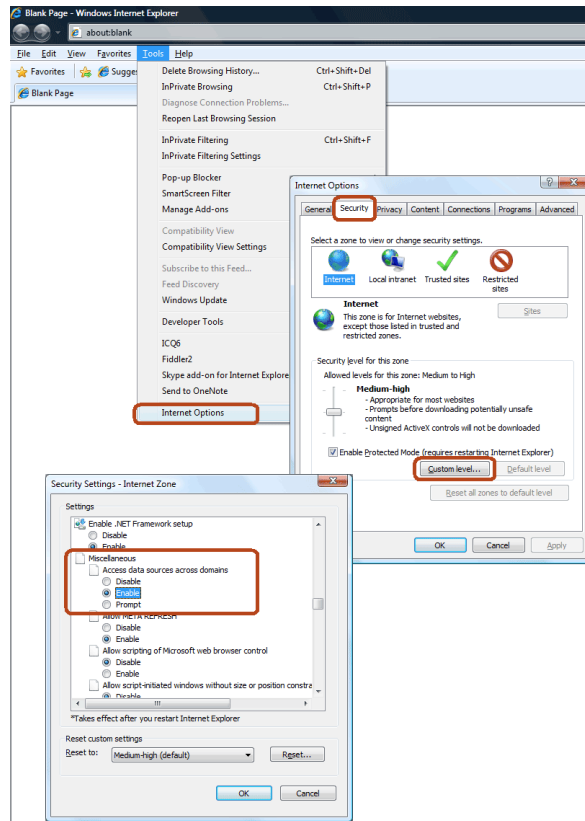
Step 1 – Launch Internet Explorer on your computer. Click the “Tools” drop-down list arrow on the toolbar, and then click “Internet Options.”

Step 2 – Click the “Security” tab. Click the “Internet” icon, then click the “Custom Level” button. Scroll down to the “Miscellaneous” section of the list in the Settings pane.

Step 3 – Select the “Enable” option under the “Access data sources across domains” label in the Miscellaneous section of the Settings list. Click the “OK” button.

Step 4 – Click the “Apply” button, then click “OK” in the Internet Options window. Exit Internet Explorer and restart it.

Network Wide

If no computer on your same network can access the videos on this site then this may indicate that there is a network setting preventing access.

Cross Origin Access Denied:

Check with your Information Services personnel to see if CORS calls (cross origin resources) are being block.

Blank page or other error:

Check with your Information Services personnel to see if site accesses to trainingvideonow.com, jwpsrv.com, or content.jwplatform.com is being blocked by your network's content filter.

Adding Videos

FIND VIDEOS TO ADD TO YOUR WATCHLIST BY USING THE SEARCH TOOLS.

- Search on keywords in the search box
- Filter videos by category
- Find items that include Spanish versions
- Filter by length of the video

ADD A VIDEO TO YOUR WATCHLIST

By clicking the Add to Watchlist button the current video preview will be added to your Watchlist. If you have more than one Watchlist you can choose which list to use before clicking the Add to Watchlist button.



This program helps us understand what signs to notice in a potentially violent person. And what actions we should take if and when we feel the threat of violent behavior.



WATCHLISTS HOLD THE VIDEOS YOU HAVE SELECTED FOR VIEWING.

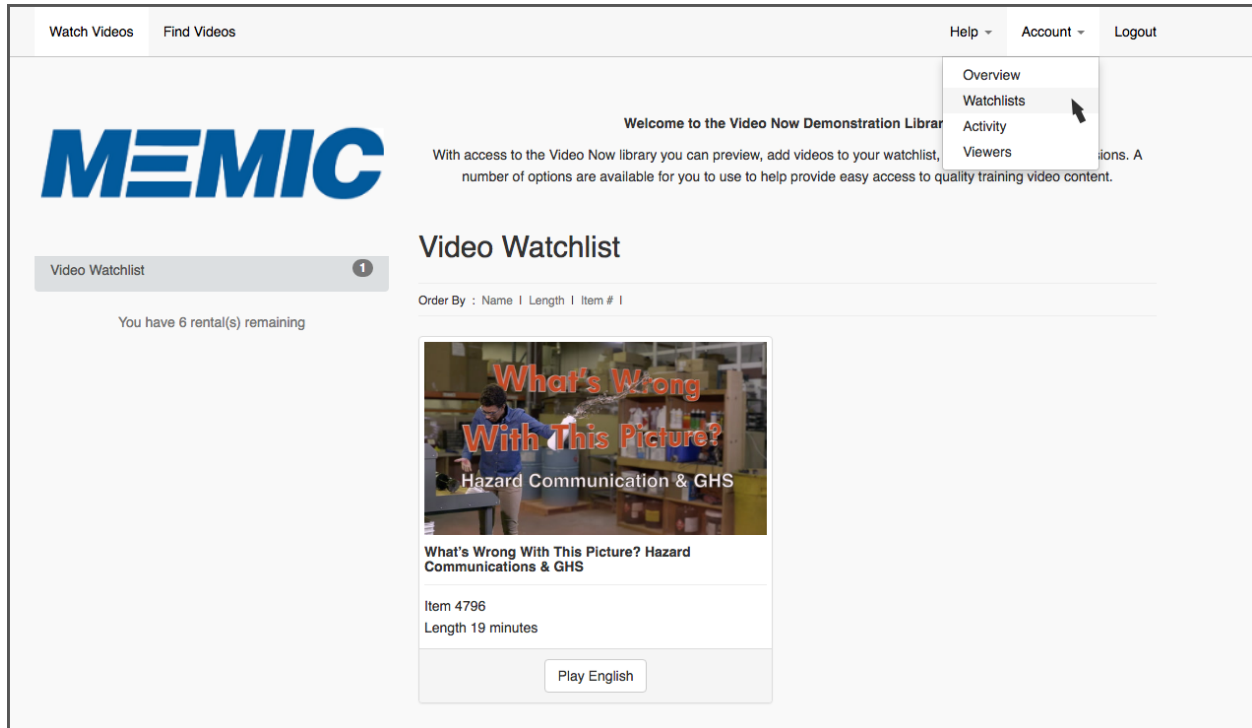
They provide easy access to the videos you need to play during a training session. You can add all your videos to one Watchlist or you can make more Watchlists to hold different groups of training videos.

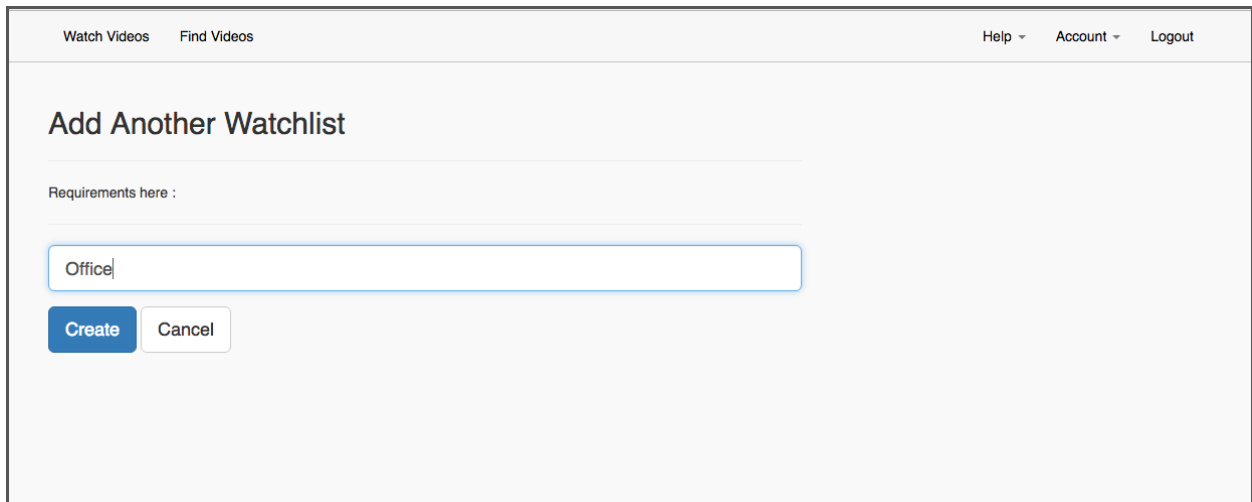
To create a Watchlist go to Account > Watchlists in the menu bar.



Click Add Another Watchlist.

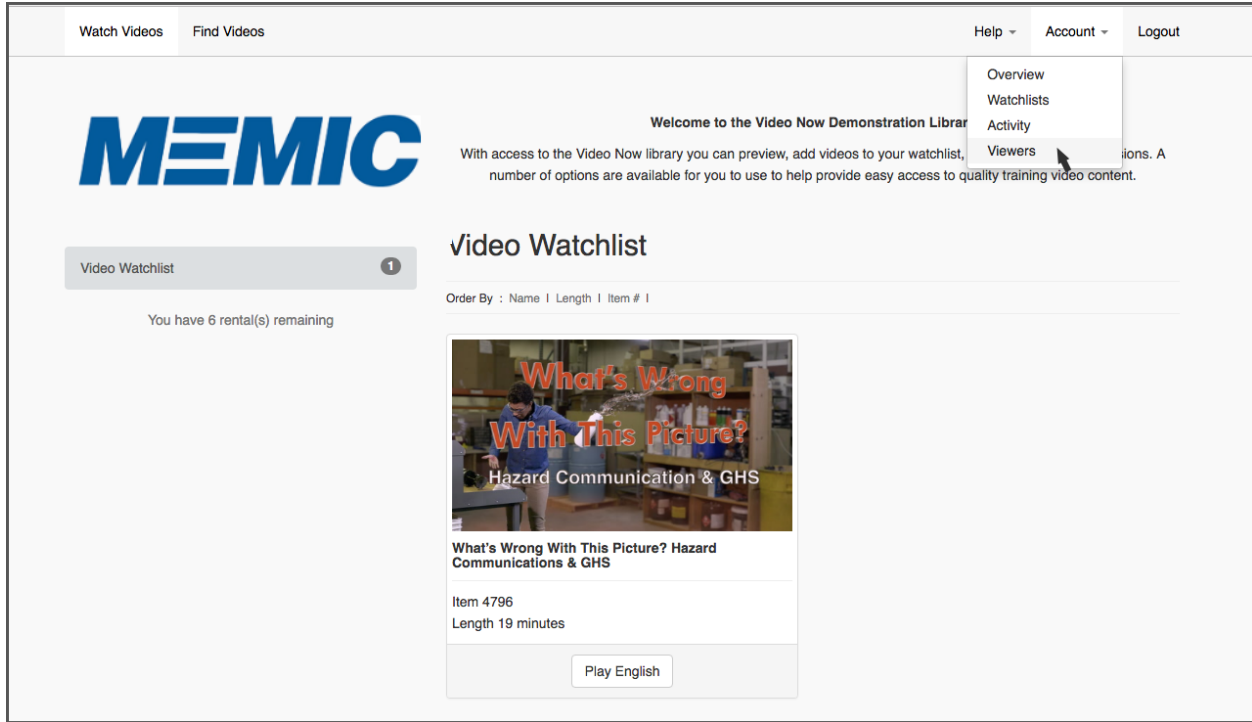


Add a Name to your Watchlist and click Create.

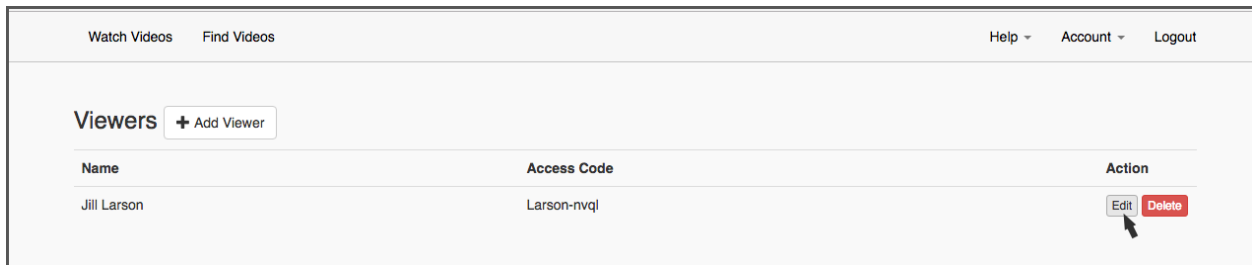


ASSIGNING WATCHLISTS


You can assign Watchlists to Viewers on the Viewers page. Go to Account > Viewers in the menu bar.



Click Edit next to the Viewer you want to modify.




Choose which Watchlists the Viewer should have access to.

Managing Viewers

WHAT IS A VIEWER?


A Viewer is a special kind of access. Logging in with the Viewer Access Code allows that person to view the already selected videos. They can't browse videos or select videos when logged in with a Viewer Access Code. They can only play the videos selected by a Trainer.

You can use the Viewer Access Code to give employees access to the videos selected by a Trainer. You can have one Viewer Access Code for everyone to use or you can make Viewer Access Codes for as many people as you want to track. Each time a Viewer watches a video that information is logged in the Activity report.

You can also assign Viewers to Watchlists (groups of videos), so you can choose which videos the Viewer has access to.

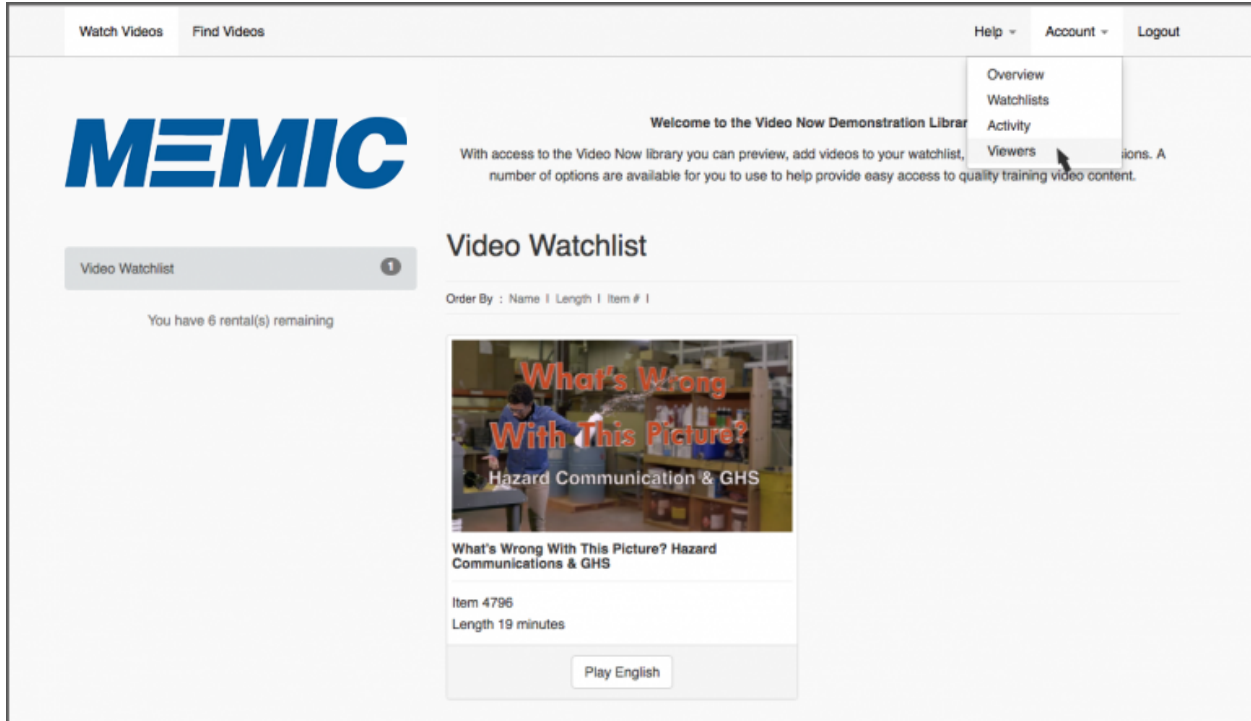

Viewers can only access the Watchlists you have assigned them. Viewers don't have the Find Videos menu. Viewers also can only see the help page on playing videos.

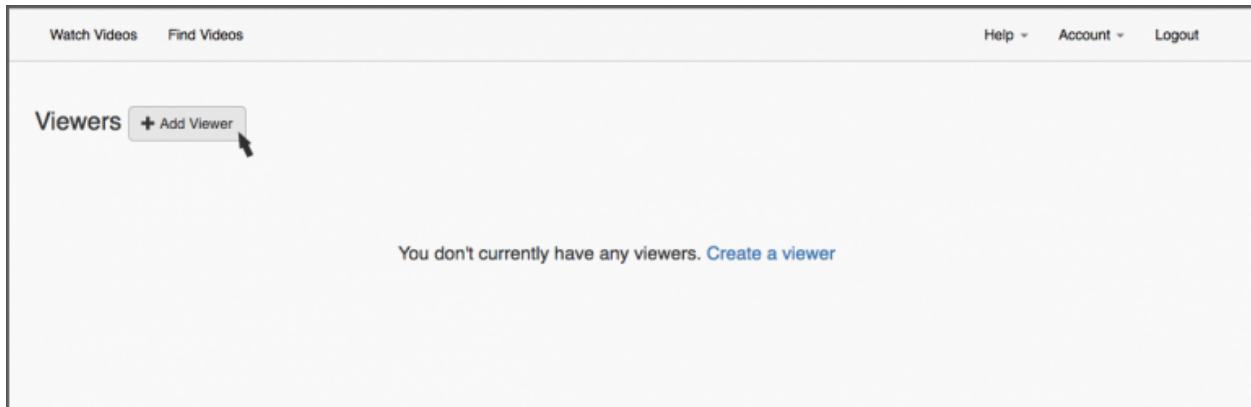

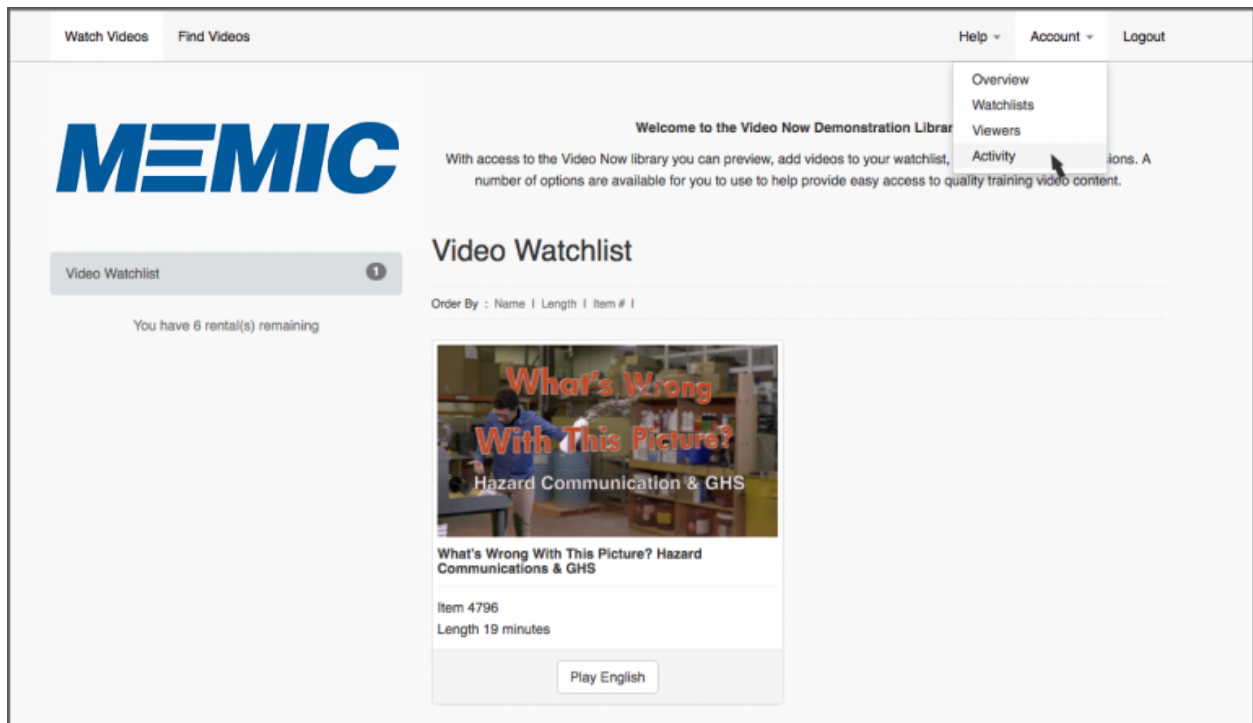
